We are writing to you as members of Branch \_\_\_\_ in \_\_\_\_\_, of the Ukrainian National Women's League of America (UNWLA). UNWLA is the oldest Ukrainian women's organization in the United States, celebrating our 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary this year. Our signature campaign, as we join together with our communities to support Ukraine as she defends herself and western democracy against russian aggression, is the **Children Praying for Children** campaign. This campaign focuses around International Children's Day – June 1, 2025 — and calls on all children in our broader communities to come together to pray for the children of Ukraine--those who have suffered injury and displacement during war and especially, those who have been abducted by russian troops and forcibly transferred to russian territory. While the plight of Ukrainian children is particularly meaningful to our Ukrainian community, we believe that the wellbeing of children is one that resonates with each and every one of us, throughout our various and distinct communities.

With that in mind, we ask that you join with us on June 1, 2025 (or thereabouts) by participating in or creating an event during which the children of \_\_\_\_\_ pray especially for Ukraine's children.
